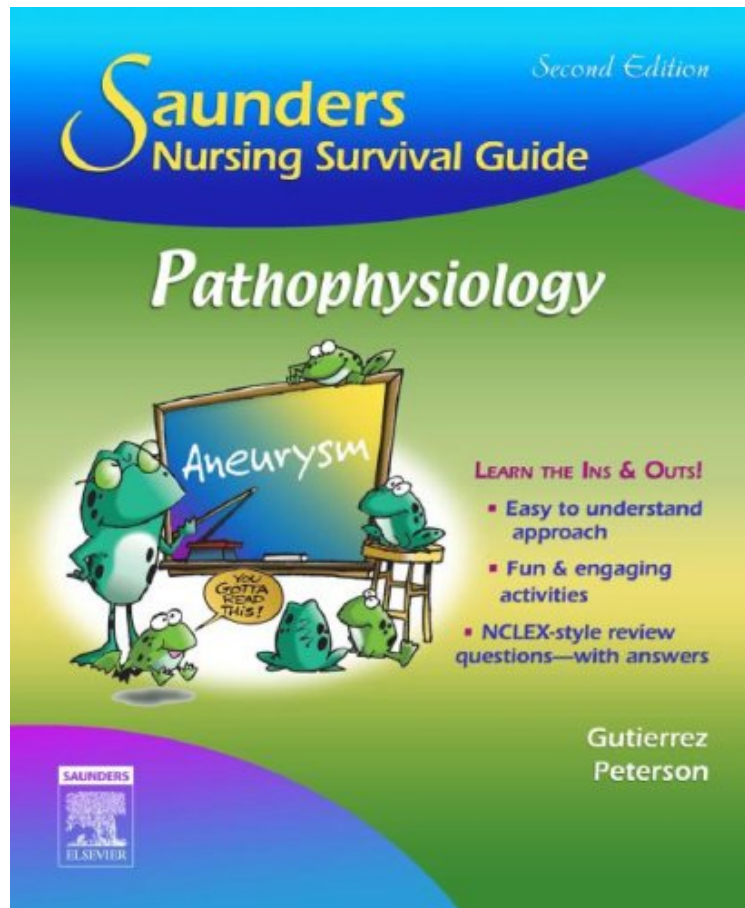


## Saunders Nursing Survival Guide: Pathophysiology, 2e
